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Welcome and Intro



In your first class, start with an intro with your name(first name only), your experience related to the subject and share your passion for the subject.

Keep your personal information private (e.g. last name, email address, mailing address, phone number, age, no need to mention that you are a student etc.,) and don't ask students to share their personal information

WARM WELCOME

In every lesson, create a safe and welcoming space for learners from all backgrounds, beliefs, and locations. Please say a quick "hello" to each student by their names and do an icebreaker if needed.

Class Exercises Routine



1. The teacher should solve few class exercises on their screen and ask students to work either one question or few of them at a time (in a strict time limit)




2. Once students are done solving, the teacher should pick a child to answer.
Discuss every question in detail and then move to next question.



3. Make sure you go around the table (not to pick the same student even though they raise their hand.)
Some kids are shy to answer or participate in class, so make sure that every student has a chance to answer and that everyone is engaged. Do not allow students to shout out answers.

Feedback reports should be created after every few classes


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APPEARANCE

Power of appearance: You create a positive impression.

Try maintaining a professional appearance and attire.



Early is on time; On time is late; Late is unacceptable!

Be prepared and login 5min before the class time.



BRIGHT & CLEAR

Always sit in a well-lit area and that direct light is on you. You can also use artificial lighting like a lamp in front of you to make it look brighter.



VIDEO SWITCHED ON

Tutors and students should always keep their videos on during class.

Use annotation, drawing, and writing on the screen to explain whenever needed.




UNSURE MOMENTS

VARIATION IN TONE

Voice modulation is very important when teaching to keep the children attentive, change your tonality in a few places especially when you are explaining the concepts.

LESS CHAOS MORE LEARNING

In your class exercises ask children to stay on mute and raise their hands (use the reaction button / raise hand feature, or even physically raise their hand in the video) to grab the teacher's attention while answering. Do not let students interrupt your flow of teaching. Politely tell them to wait until you have finished.

Lesson Presentation Structure

1	STUDENT INTERACTION	A friendly welcome to the class.
2	REPORT ON GIVEN HOMEWORK	Ascertain to mention the significance of homework every week
3	LEARNING OBJECTIVES	What would the kids be able to learn by the end of this lesson.
4	WARM-UP	Ask questions or conduct activities related to the concept you are going to clarify.
5	CONCEPT EXPLANATION	The theory and definitions of the subject is explained in details.
6	EXAMPLES	Teacher shows how to solve these examples OR shows books, articles, videos.
7	EXERCISES IN CLAS	Kids solve the questions and answer in turns.
8	TIPS TO REMEMBEI	Share the tools, tips, and techniques to remember better.
